Attached is a copy of the Annual Water Quality Report from Fort Pierce Utility Authority (FPUA), which supplies water to Nettles Island. In addition to the testing done by FPUA, we test within our distribution system for coliform bacteria, lead, copper, disinfectant residual and disinfection byproducts. No coliform bacteria were detected in samples collected from the system in 2018. The following table shows the results for the most recent lead and copper and disinfectant residual testing.
